

What we believe

The Trinity Methodist Church family affirms:

- The Bible as the inspired word of Almighty God, without error as originally written. The Bible is the complete revelation of God's will for humanity, and is the only unyielding rule of belief and practice for following Jesus as Lord.
- The sovereignty of one Almighty God, creator of all things, holy and worthy of our worship, who exists eternally in three persons - Father, Son and Holy Spirit - each equal in essence, majesty, and power.
- The deity of Jesus the Messiah (or Christ), the only-begotten Son of Almighty God: His miraculous conception by the Holy Spirit; His birth from a virgin; His sinless life; His atoning death on the cross; His bodily resurrection; His ascension to the right hand of God the Father; and His imminent return.
- The deity and present ministry of the Holy Spirit, who enables saving faith in Jesus Christ, and who empowers every disciple's spiritual life, gifts, and ministry.
- Humanity was created by and for Almighty God; and that by disobeying God, every person has incurred spiritual death, separation from God, and physical death. Every person is a sinner by nature, choice, and practice.
- Our Lord, Jesus Christ, sacrificially died for all our sins and was raised to life on the third day so that all who put their trust in Him will be redeemed from the penalty of sin and declared righteous (justified). This salvation is the undeserved gift of God, based on Jesus' sinless life and sacrifice, and not on anything good that we have done.
- That through the ministry of the Holy Spirit, Jesus established the Church and empowered His followers to be His disciples, teach His commands, and serve others as His body on earth. The universal Church is comprised of all who put their faith in Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.
- Every person will face judgment after life on earth. Those saved by grace through faith in Jesus are given everlasting life with Almighty God in His eternal kingdom. Those who reject the Lord Jesus and His salvation receive everlasting punishment and separation from God.
